S. Scot Litke, Hon. D.GE

General

Scot received his Bachelor's Degree from Ohio University and conducted Masters Studies at the University of Massachusetts, followed by further Graduate Studies at the University of Colorado. From 1982-2014 he served as the Editor-in-Chief of the ADSC's (International Association of Foundation Drilling) *Foundation Drilling* magazine. He held the position of Executive Director of the ADSC from 1982 through 2009. During this time, Litke managed over 25 drilled foundation and anchored earth retention research projects funded by the ADSC, State Departments of Transportation, and the FHWA. Under his guidance the ADSC grew from a membership of 120 with a budget of just over \$100,000 to become one of the most respected trade associations in the deep foundations industry with an annual budget of over \$2,000,000. He was the association's official liaison to State Departments of Transportation, The FHWA, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, OSHA, the American Subcontractors Association, and other industry groups. He served as the Chairman of ASA's Associations Council for two years. He was a founding member of the Geo-Council (now the Geo Coalition), where he served on the Executive Board. As one of its responsibilities the Geo-Council administered the FHWA's National Geotechnical Experimentation Site program. Litke was a member of that program's Executive Committee. Following his significant contribution to the society in 2012 Litke was inducted into ADSC's Hall of Fame.

Education and Training Programs

A sample of the programs developed and managed by Scot are the ADSC/Industry Advancement Fund's Civil Engineering Graduate Study Scholarship Program; the Deep Foundations Workshop for Civil Engineering Faculty; the Management Personnel Training Institute; and the Supervisory Personnel Training Program. Scot has served as the Moderator for over 90 Drilled Shaft, Anchored Earth Retention, Micropile, and related deep foundation industry seminars, conference sessions, workshops, and training programs.

Publications Specific

Prior to becoming the Executive Director of the ADSC Scot was a partner in Pacific Publishing Associates, Seattle, WA. In 1980 Scot received the prestigious magazine industry's "MAGGIE AWARD" for Best Circulation Promotion Program. One of his first tasks when coming aboard with the ADSC was to create, manage and serve as the editor of an association magazine that would serve as the association's flagship publication. In 2005 *Foundation Drilling Magazine* received the Printing and Imaging's Association of MidAmerica, "Best of Category Award". He was a member of a task force that developed the Geo-Institute of ASCE's official publication, "Geo-Strata Magazine", for which he received an Award of Appreciation. He has edited and/or written the Forward for a number of industry publications including the "FHWA's *Design and Construction of Drilled Shaft Foundations Manual*, by Dr. Lymon Reese and Dr. Michael O'Neill; "Prentice Hall's, *Foundations in Problem Soils*" by Dr. Stephen Greenfield; Wiley Publishing's, *Nondestructive Testing of Deep Foundations*, by Bernie Hertlein and Dr. Allen Davis; and, *Residential Foundation Performance*, and *Infrastructure Evaluation, Maintenance, and Repair*", by Dr. Tom Witherspoon, published by the ADSC Technical Library. In addition he has written numerous articles and White Papers that have appeared in a variety of deep foundation industry publications.

Professional Service

From 2010-2013 Litke was a Founding Member of the Board of Trustees of the ASCE /Geo-Institute's Academy of Geo-Professionals. He was recently awarded the Academy's title of Honorary Diplomat of

Geotechnical Engineering. He has been active on multiple industry committees for associations such as ASCE, ISSMFE, AASHTO T-15, Geo-Coalition, USACE, OSHA/ADSC Alliance and others. In 1994 he received the "ASCE Civil Engineering Research Foundation/ U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Certificate of Appreciation" for the work he did on the joint organizations' "Peer Review Program".

He was the recipient of the U.S. Universities Council of Geotechnical Engineering Research's "2004 Research Achievement Award". In 2014 he was granted the title "Member Emeritus" by the ASCE/Geo-Institute's Deep Foundations Committee. Most recently he was the recipient of the Deep Foundations Institute's "2014 Distinguished Service Award". He is a member of the "DFI's Distinguished Service Award" Selection Committee, and the organization's, "Legends of the Geo-Industry Award" Selection Committee.

Speaker and Lecturer

A noted speaker, Litke has been the invited lecturer for numerous industry events including DFI's Hal Hunt Lecture in 2002; the 1992 U.S. Air Force's Distinguished Lecture Series; Schnabel Engineering's 2008 University Lecturer; Keynote Speaker; the ADSC's 2005 Geo 3 Conference; Keynote speaker at the International Society for Micropiles Tribute to Al DiMillio; and in 2011 he was the Keynote Speaker at the Annual Meeting of the Canadian Geotechnical Society's Ontario Branch. He serves as the Master of Ceremonies at a number of geo-industry conferences, seminars, and meetings.
